DESCRIPTION OF COURSE

The 6th Grade World Studies program enables students to explore the historical development of people, places, and patterns of life from ancient times until 1500 A.D. in terms of Western civilization. The study of history rests on knowledge of dates, names, places, events, and ideas. Historical understanding, however, requires students to engage in historical thinking. Students engaged in historical thinking draw upon chronological thinking, as well as historical comprehension, analysis, interpretation, research, and decision-making.
